

What Can I recycle?

Yes! Please Recycle These Items:

- Newspaper & Inserts
- Magazines & Catalogs
- Junk Mail & Envelopes
- Cardboard
- Office and School Papers (colored paper)
- Boxboard (cereal, cake & cracker boxes)
- Brown Paper Bags (grocery)
- Aluminum Cans
- Tin and Steel Cans
- Plastic Milk Jugs
- Plastic Bottles (with necks only)
- Phone Books

Basic Rule of Thumb: If an item has the recycling symbol on it (except for polystyrene foam products or glass), and it is free of food residue, include it as a recyclable item and put it in your recycling container.

No! Do Not Recycle These Items:

- No Plastic Bags — **NOTE:** We do encourage the use of plastic bags to hold other recyclables such as papers, especially shredded documents, which are difficult to keep contained. Please tie these bags securely to prohibit them from flying out of the recycling truck. When disposing of plastic bags in your regular garbage container, please bundle them up into one bag and secure them well, to keep them from flying out of the garbage truck, and littering our streets.
- No Food-Tainted Items
- No Ice Cream Cartons
- No polystyrene foam products (disposable coffee cups, coolers or packaging materials)
- No Pizza Boxes

- No Waxy/Paper Milk Cartons
- No Aluminum Foil
- No Plastic Cups & Silverware
- No Aerosol Cans
- No Other Plastics (hangers, food trays, etc.)
- No Juice Boxes / Bags
- No Garbage or Yard Waste Material
- No Glass*

*Glass cannot be accepted for recycling at this time because broken glass contaminates the other recyclables and decreases market value. Glass items are accepted at County drop-off centers.
